The way to maximize your success rate is to match the right plant with the right soil and light conditions:

- Keep **Unplanted trees** cool, moist, and out of direct sunlight before planting or heeling in. Heeling in provides temporary care by digging a long trench on the shady side of a building, placing the roots of the plants in the trench and then filling the soil back in.
- Keep **the roots moist** at all times (a warm, dry wind takes only a minute to dry out root hairs).
- Make **holes deep & large enough** to insure that all tree roots are not crowded, upturned or exposed.

No mixing of species to receive per quantity price. No refunds for any orders not picked up. Grafton County Conservation District (GCCD) will not be responsible for typos, or plants once they leave the pick-up site. GCCD reserves the right to refund money for trees or shrubs or other items that become unavailable. GCCD will not be responsible for any plants not picked up on the delivery date.
