The way to maximize your success rate is to match the right plant with the right soil and light conditions:

- Keep unplanted trees cool, moist, and out of direct sunlight before planting or heeling in. Heeling in provides temporary care by digging a long trench on the shady side of a building, placing the roots of the plants in the trench and then filling the soil back in.
- Keep the roots moist at all times (a warm, dry wind takes only a minute to dry out root hairs).
- Make holes deep & large enough to insure that all tree roots are not crowded, upturned or exposed.
